



The Triple Aim





A recent international study compared 11 nations on health care quality, access, efficiency, and equity, as well as indicators of healthy lives such as infant mortality.












# Key Messages from IOM: The Future of Nursing


- 1. Nurses should practice to the full extent of their education and training.
- 2. Nurses should achieve higher levels of education and training through an improved education system that promotes seamless academic progression.
- 3. Nurses should be full partners, with physicians and other health care professionals, in redesigning health care in the United States.
- 4. Effective workforce planning and policy making require better data collection and an improved information infrastructure.

## Impact of APRN on Health Outcomes

- IOM (2012) released a report on the future of APRN with the number one recommendation to remove scope of practices barriers and allow for full practice.
- This is particularly important in the current health care environment where issues of access to cost-effective, quality care are key.
- According to CMS, states that utilize full practice APRN have shown a decrease in preventable hospitalization rates and readmission rates in the Medicare & Medicaid population.

#### Louisiana APRN Statistics

- Total # of APRNs in Louisiana is 3,651 (2013).
- ■Total # of Nurse Practitioners in Louisiana is 2,205 (2013).
- Primary care settings including nursing homes.
- ■58% increase in # of Nurse Practitioners in Louisiana between 2008-2012.


